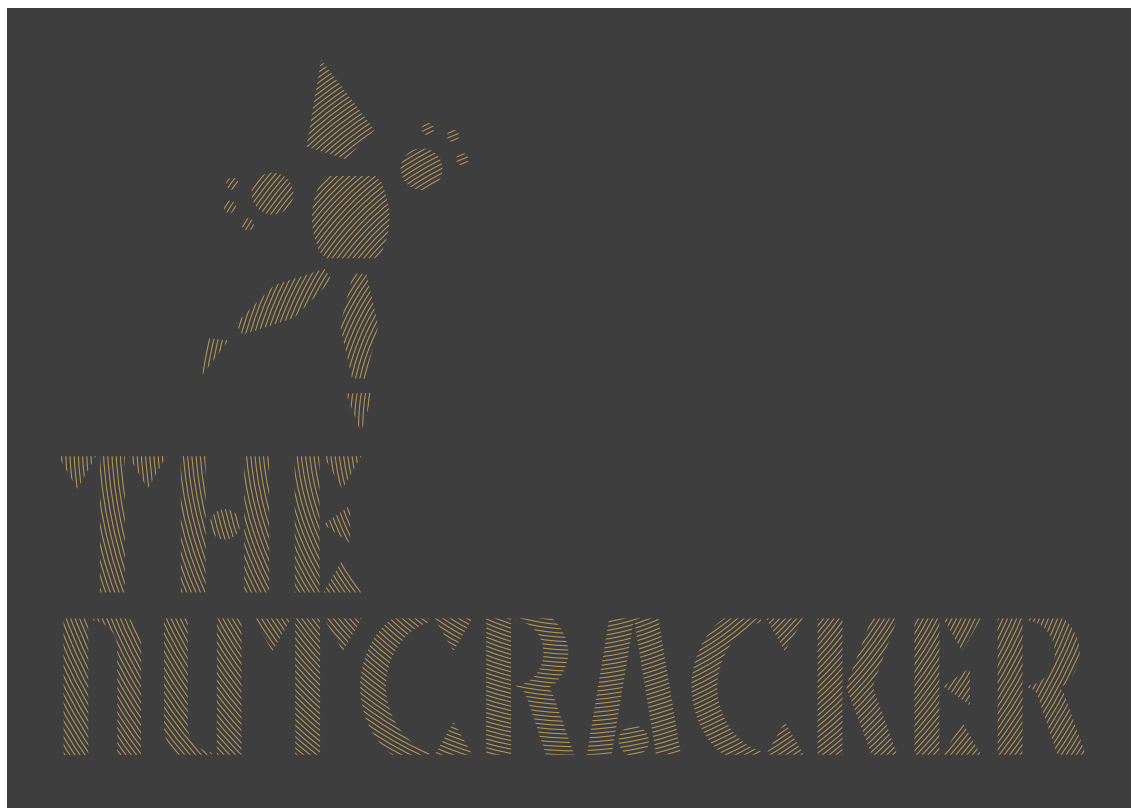


The Nutcracker

The Nutcracker is considered a timeless score and is a staple of the winter season.

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Guilherme Dable was born 1976 in Porto Alegre, Brazil. He graduated with a MFA in Visual Arts, Universidade Federal do Rio Grande do Sul Art Institute, Porto Alegre in 2012. Mary Ann Aitken (1960 – 2012). Mary grew up in Detroit and attended Wayne State University, USA where in 1983 she received a BA in Fine Art. She continued her education by receiving a MA in Art Therapy in 1989. Shortly after receiving this she made the bold decision to move to NYC. She was an art therapist for Woodhull Hospital in Brooklyn where she worked for 22 years assisting patients in their personal struggles, teaching them tools necessary to express themselves through art. She exhibited her paintings, drawings and photographs in several group shows in Brooklyn, NY as well as Detroit.



Massimo Nordio was born 1947 in Venice, Italy. Trained as a cinematographer and photographer, he is a longtime collector of 20th century Venetian Glass and was hired in 1980 to produce a series of definitive monographs on important modern glass artists from Murano, such as: Carlo Scarpa, Napoleone Martinuzzi, Ercole Barovier, Fulvio Bianconi. At the same time he began designing his own pieces, and in the early nineties he devotes himself utterly to research and free-lance glass designing. Nordio's pieces are on permanent display at museums worldwide, including the Museo Vetrario Murano, Musée des Arts Décoratifs Paris and the Chrysler Museum of Art, New York. Massimo lives and works in Venice.

Mimei Thompson was born 1972 in Tokyo, Japan. She studied Fine Art Photography at Glasgow School of Art and did her MA in Painting at the Royal College of Art, graduating in 2005. She was selected for Jerwood Contemporary Painters in 2010, and has work in the Arts Council Collection. After studying Architecture at TU Karlsruhe he studied Fine Art at Art Academy Karlsruhe in 1996, followed by Art Academy Düsseldorf in 1999, where he graduated in 2001. In 2003 he won the prestigious Villa Romana Award including a nine month residency in Florence, Italy. In 2006 he was awarded with the 60th Bergischer Kunstpreis by the Kunstmuseum Baden, Solingen.
